### Out of the Loft

I am told that as you advance in years, the loft space in your house can become a burden or even an embarrassment. A recent expedition up the loft ladder in my home delivered both sentiments as I realised the immediate need for a declutter as a result of the growing accumulation of possessions that should have been disposed of decades ago. A set of skis that are no longer 'cool', clothes that no longer fit and Christmas lights that defy health and safety regulations – to mention just a small selection of accumulated clutter.

But it has also revealed box files full of documents and old letters – dating back to the early 70's. Handbooks from those early Filey conventions and the first Spring Harvests – not to mention the early documentation relating to Saltmine and even the first slide story explaining the origins, still in place on Kodak Carousel Projectors. Remember those? But hoarding is a mixed blessing. Great reminders of events and history but, if like me, you have a fascination with the past, it can become that burden that needs to be lightened. The skip is on order alongside an industrial capacity shredder. And all of this is rather strange to someone who is actually committed to moving on – doing the 'Carpe Diem' and planning for whatever days God may grant.

I guess the key is 'balance' – holding on to that which is good, right and true, and disposing of unwanted baggage and lightening the load for the days ahead. And I think that is what I was trying to communicate in my last letter. Some partners thought I was suggesting it was time to draw

stumps and others offered messages to encourage the 'keep on keeping on' mentality. What I was trying to convey was the need to refocus for such a time as this, avoiding uncommissioned work, but investing in others and keeping the flag flying for mission and a distinct Christian ethos in community initiatives, education and in wider society. My commitment remains the same. It is just that I am becoming more measured in what I do and the responsibilities entrusted to me. I hope that the following reports and updates support that perspective.

## **State of the Nation**

I will resist commenting on Brexit, but sadly the wider perspective confirms the redundancy of good leadership on the world stage as well as the paucity of integrity and wisdom across all parties in our Nation. The Christian voice has become a whisper in the corridors of power and the influence of the church is as dying embers in the fireplaces that once gave out heat and light. Against this background you can either retreat further into the Christian cocoon or determine to rekindle the fire in the place where you are, or where you have a measure of influence or indeed where people will listen. Now that is my current focus in Flame – alongside bringing encouragement to those who are trying to do the same.

## **Chaplaincy**

The provision and support of chaplains in schools continues to be an integral part of Flame's ministry. Supporting Gerry Denston in his tireless efforts in establishing chaplaincy teams, I have been so blessed and encouraged to see this work blossom and grow. Please pray that our Sixth Form Conference in November will be well attended. It will focus on mental health and will of course have a Christian perspective with guest speakers and various workshops. I shall be speaking on managing stressful situations, so please pray for this event – and in particular for Gerry who is organising the day alongside the Head of Sixth Form in the Invictus Academies.

Indeed I am writing this letter after a formal chaplaincy meeting where we listened to stories of students asking searching questions about the relevance of Christ in today's society and queries about faith. Chaplaincies are a wonderful way of establishing Christian truth in

predominantly secular areas and secular situations and that is primarily why Flame is focusing on this development at this time.

### **Q3 Academies**

I continue in my role in and around Q3, although I have served notice regarding my role on the main Board. I shall focus primarily on Q3 Langley – a growing school which will eventually accommodate 1500 students. I serve as Chair of Governors but have input at other levels.



Please pray for the effectiveness of my Christian assemblies to be delivered 4 times on 13th December. Of course I am involved at other levels, but it is a privilege to serve in this situation alongside our Head of School who is more than supportive of the Christian ethos.

### **St James' House**

'Tis done, the great transaction's done' – to quote the hymn writer. And now we begin to search for a small office base in the locality. We have to vacate the premises early in the New Year, so please pray that we might find accommodation as soon as possible with some storage facility. It needs to be 'safe and secure from all alarms' to quote another hymn writer, and it also needs to be easily accessible and provide a functional base from where Jackie can work. Do keep your knees bent on our behalf.

### **New Project in Romania**



It was 2 years ago when Calin Rezmuves – practical assistant at Flame – headed up a project in association with the Social Services in Maramures, to raise support for the provision of 16 beds and some bedroom furniture for a home for children with mental disabilities. Through the generosity of the Flame family this home was re-equipped, and Flame highly commended for its support and commitment. Since that time, Calin has been asked to support another home in the same locality that is needing provisions and I visited in early October to assess the situation and look at the potential of developing a new project.

I discovered a facility that looks after 12 children and some young adults – again ‘spartan’ beds, but also a lack of outdoor provision for therapy and exercise. Flame is therefore launching an appeal to provide 12 new beds, but also the support needed to install a play area with appropriate equipment for rehabilitation / adapted swings / recreational aids and exercise equipment. The Director comes with an excellent track record of working in the situation, and over the next 6 months we are looking to raise approximately £12,000.00 for this cause.



If you can help, you will find more detail online over the next few days, and we are also designing a brochure to highlight the project. Why not make it your Christmas project for your church family? Many churches take up a Christmas offering and give to a worthwhile cause, so this might be appropriate for your fellowship? I can send you some extra detail if so required.

Philip and his wife Janet are always a joy to work with, and I am privileged to know them both as good friends and co-workers in Christian ministry. The title of the tour reflects Philip’s new book – originally written in conjunction with Dr Brand – but a must read. Thanks to the Leprosy Mission for making it all possible.

## Time Out

Another excellent family conference last October in the wonderfully hospitable Redcliffe Hotel in Paignton. Great ministry from Rev Willie Black – formerly serving with OMF – supported by visiting guest speakers. Next year will be the 20th Anniversary of Time Out, not that there is anything significant in a number, but the hotel is booked 12th – 16th October 2020. However, knowing me as you do, you will understand when I say that it is necessary from time to time to re-assess



and re-imagine, so, over these next few months we shall be spending time researching other ways whereby we can bring the Flame family together for refreshment, updating, ministry etc. Now as I said, next year is booked and our Bible reading speaker will be David Coffey, supported by the usual wider team of speakers, but I do welcome any comment or advice that you might have as we plan for future Flame family retreats / events.

## Snippets

1. The holiday to Madeira in February is full with a waiting list. The popularity of this late winter break has taken us by surprise, and currently 48 people comprise the party destined for this beautiful island in the Atlantic
2. Wake-up call – A visit to the GP, followed by time with a vascular consultant revealed a blocked vertebral artery in my neck. No surgery can be performed without significant risk so it is a course of appropriate medication, less stress (!), more exercise and other lifestyle adjustment. I am at peace with the diagnosis and have to be realistic that although my E levels are still high (energy and enthusiasm), my PC (physical capabilities) are sometimes challenged. I am told that sleep is often the best therapy but in short supply for the more mature, and it is the over 70's that tune into Radio 4 quite early in the morning and know the shipping forecast for the following day!
